News and Announcements

Alliance of Independent Academic Medical Centers National Initiative Impact Award

Kaiser Permanente Northern California (KPNC) Graduate Medical Education (GME) has been selected as the 2026 winner of the Alliance of Independent Academic Medical Centers (AIAMC) National Initiative Impact Award, a national honor recognizing transformative innovations in academic medicine and quality improvement across member institutions. Under the leadership of **Theresa Azevedo-Rousso**, MPA, Regional Senior Director & Designated Institutional Official (DIO) for KPNC Undergraduate & Graduate Medical Education, the National Initiative IV project grew from a single-site pilot into a regionwide model that strengthened research culture, scholarly infrastructure, and trainee experience across GME.

The initiative expanded access to expert research support, enhanced faculty engagement, and accelerated resident and fellow scholarly productivity, while advancing institutional priorities in research excellence, health equity, and our learning health system model. Supported by regionwide investment and close partnership with Kaiser Permanente Research Northern California (Division of Research, Biostatistical Consulting Unit) and medical center leaders (GME Physician Research Leads, Research Project Managers, Program Directors and Directors of Medical Education), the program has generated broad national impact, with hundreds of scholarly projects, peer-reviewed publications, and presentations at major scientific meetings, and now serves as a scalable framework for strengthening GME research across Kaiser Permanente and beyond.

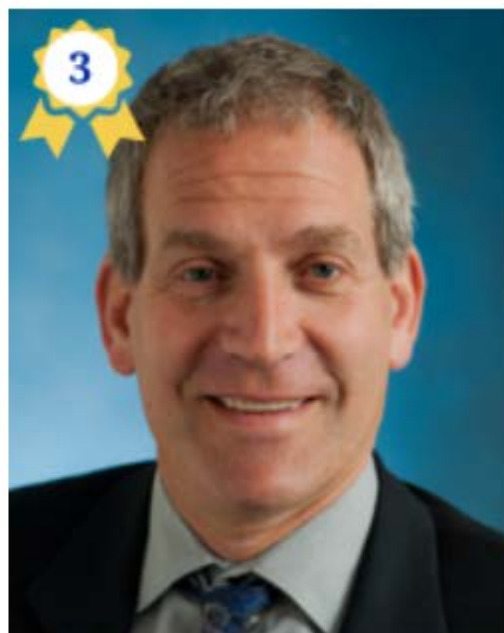

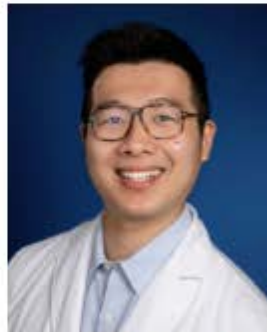

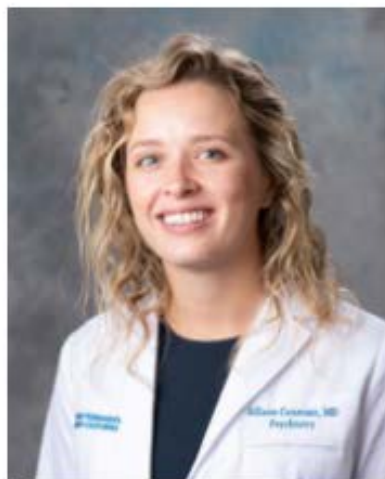
